The exhibit, titled "Once Upon a Sketch", offers a behind-the-scenes look at the art of children's book illustration through Heather's sketches, paintings, and narrative development work. Heather's art will hang till December 15th. Also, Heather's latest picture book, Something To Sing About (In Your Heart Books, 2024) was recently awarded an Honorable Mention by the Purple Dragonfly awards for picture books 6+ category. Meet Heather with her book, Cory and the Seventh Story, featured at the 12 Corners Presbyterian Church of Rochester vendor table at the RCTBF.

Tina Shepardson has enjoyed sharing her book, *The Sorry Seeds* with schools. In a recent program they opened with singing "The Sorry Song" in the morning assembly to kick off the day of exploring both sides of apologies, giving and receiving with roleplaying in sessions throughout the day. *The Sorry Seeds* earned the Teacher Favorite 2025 Category Award from the Children's Book Council in April of this year.

Rose O'Keefe has been doing presentations about the Frederick Douglass Family: two at the Rochester Festival to Go at Rochester City School #4, for 5th and 6th graders on Oct. 29, and also at the Rochester Children & Teens Book Festival.

Deena Viviani's debut picture book, *Wendell Called Me Weird!* will be released in Spring 2026 in both English and Dutch. It is illustrated by Olya Seidova and published by Clavis Publishing.

Andrea Page was a panelist on Booklist's "Native American and Indigenous Voices" webinar on November 2. Later this month (on the 21st) she'll be at the NCTE Conference in Denver. She'll be speaking on a panel about how Native books and stories can be universal and culturally specific while challenging stereotypes and common misconceptions.

Query Cafe:

TIP #5: Perfect your Pitch!

Purpose of the pitch: pique interest, show you can write well, entice agent/editor to read your manuscript.

- Who is the MAIN CHARACTER of your story?
- What do they WANT?
- What OBSTACLES are standing in their way?
- What ACTIONS do they take to get what they want?
- What do they LEARN in the end?

Pitch formula:

[MC] wants more than anything in the world to [wants], but they can't because [obstacles], so they [actions] and learn [learn].

Not all stories will follow this formula. If you have a unique story structure there might be a better way to formulate the pitch. Look for examples online or with the help of your critique partners.


